

AJC announces \$10,000 reward for serving US Courts summons on Indian PM Narendra Modi

New York, United States (September 26, 2014): A US based Rights Group American Justice Center has announced an reward of \$10,000 for successful service of US court summons on visiting Indian PM Narendra Modi. The award for serving Modi has been announced due to the fact that the PM's visit will only last 5 days and will include a packed schedule of meetings and speeches.

The US Federal Court for the Southern District of New York had issued summons against the Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi for his role in the massacres committed in Gujarat during 2002, when he was Chief Minister of the Indian state.

Attorney Gurpatwant Singh Pannun, legal advisor to AJC stated that "we intend to serve the summons to PM Narendra Modi to hold him accountable before foreign courts for his complicity in the Gujarat pogrom of 2002."
